As Lauren Long, Executive Director of Student Involvement at George Mason, puts it: "We're the fun on campus!"

A lively campus and vibrant student-led organizations play a crucial role in the student experience, boosting satisfaction, retention, and enrollment. That's why, when a popular esports club on campus approached the Office of Student Involvement for support, the university was only too happy to get involved.

Lauren Long recalls: "The esports club really wanted to be able to compete at varsity level, which requires close affiliation with the university, direct financing, and support. I couldn't say no to a bunch of students who were so passionate about being engaged on campus!"

In 2018, the new varsity-level George Mason Esports was born. A departmental student organization within Student Involvement, George Mason Esports is a highly accomplished collegiate program in Northern Virginia, providing community for students interested in all levels of the esports experience.

Bigger and better

Lauren Long adds: "Lenovo challenged us to think big, and their esports experts provided so much insight and support to help us grow our program. Lenovo not only provides top-of-the-line Legion gaming PCs for our existing esports space but is also helping us to design a brand-new esports arena. Lenovo also supports our annual GAMEmason event."

GAMEmason is a multi-day gaming convention hosted at George Mason's Fairfax campus, which features guest speakers from the gaming industry, educational sessions, esports tournaments, free arcade machines, tabletop and console gaming, an artist alley featuring work by George Mason students, and vendors and businesses from across the game industry. In Spring 2024, with the help of Lenovo, GAMEmason hosted the largest in-person collegiate esports event run by a university, bringing together 34 varsity-level collegiate esports teams from across the region to compete in tournaments including Rocket League, League of Legends, Overwatch 2, Valorant, Omega Strikers, and Super Smash Bros.

This year, George Mason took advantage of the Lenovo Esports Event Service to provide an end-to-end service. This included the delivery and setup of 80 Legion desktops, monitors, and accessories for the esports tournaments, as well as project management, on-site assistance, and disassembly at the end of event.

Results

Today, George Mason Esports is one of the most popular student organizations on campus. There are currently 130 team players competing in seven games at the varsity. The George Mason Esports Discord has over 3,500 members, and the weekly Super Smash Bros. meetup that was first started by the gaming club now attracts more than 100 students every week.

GAMEmason Spring 2024 hosted the largest collegiate varsity esports LAN tournament organized by a U.S. university. GAMEmason Spring 2024 saw 34 teams come to Fairfax to compete to be the best in the nation.

Reflecting on the success of the George Mason Esports program, Lauren Long says: "We absolutely could not have made this happen without Lenovo."




